

## **Back to School Notes:**

3 Goals: Survey, Equipment needed for COVID-19, Concerns/Do's & Don'ts

What staff can do? Quarantined after travel? Etc.

Policy?

Transportation?

Student Options – If they choose to stay home (it would be based on quarter or semesters)

No live teaching – distance will be recorded or digital or packets

Staff rotate while students stay put

Lunch tables in gym

What to do during live spread (2 or 4 week closure in place)

Temping staff/students – when and how much?

Temp is now 99.6 for the cut-off

Symptoms (possibly only need 2 to get tested)

Working on putting in a machine to do a 45 minute rapid test at the clinic

Parent/Planning survey questions:

How do you rate your distance learning experience?

What went well – rate the following (tech, communication, etc.)

What challenges did your students experience (schedule, place to work,

Do you plan on sending your child in the fall? (# of cases, etc.)

What would you like to see in place (daily cleaning, temps, smaller class sizes, etc.)

Students stay within their class and don't rotate rooms?

## **Discussion points:**

What staff will feel comfortable coming in to work? (Staff Survey?)

What protection are you taking at home to protect your family?

Policy – what symptom signifies a reason to send students home?

Internet – home internet issues (hot spots, spotty service, etc.)

Temperature – one a day, in the morning – could do, two a day if wanted to

Percentage of people positive – when do we quarantine – what do we do when staff/students exposed

Lunchroom in the morning, salad bar cancelled, disposable silverware, plastic silverware, serve in rooms

Change the time students are entering the building 7:40 – but staff not here until 8:00

At what point would it be better to just distance learn rather than feel like 'jail' – home safe

Policy in place for students to attend after school events but yet at home learning

Deb O. – Kathy Scheidt – Head Start (staff wear masks, kids don't, sanitize all day, disposable everything)

Parents have the right to have their students wear masks if they want to.

Families within our district have stated that if we close, they will homeschool.

Staff prepping for a sub if they can't access the building. Will subs come in?

Tony – disinfectant spray guns should help with the cleaning

Regular staff illnesses – can staff still work

COVID-19 positive - is it sick leave or not if staff are forced to stay home?

FLMA – job guarantee

Sick leave staff at home – do they or can they still teach or answer from home?

Sub would possibly be paid to monitor children while staff paid to teach from home?

What does a day look like for staff if you are teaching 8-4:00 when do they touch base with the distance learning students? Possibly – set meetings

Looking at possibly limiting the special minutes – and a specific time and day per week.

Recording the lessons will not be the same quality - Parents will need support in the evenings

Students 9-12 could possibly take classes over the virtual school

Grades – distance learning vs. in-class work – keeping grades consistent or equal

Hours for cleaning within the classrooms, hallways, etc. (staff, students daily clean) deep clean (janitors)

Is it possible to build in time/days once a week to do the recording lessons?

Guidelines for specials – do they need to do those? Probably once a week – maybe set up lessons

Are you going to expect social distancing in the classrooms?

Utilize space the best we can with what we have to accommodate the 6 ft.

Make this a teachable moment with the students.

No in-person singing with any students – even in the classrooms.
