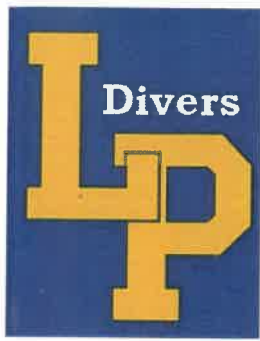

Title I News

December 2021

Some highlights of the Title I program in the Kindergarten through 5th Grade classrooms currently are:

*In Kindergarten, we are working on letter recognition and letter sounds, and sight word reading within small groups.

*In 1st grade, we are working on reading skills during Library/Lexia Core 5 time.

*2nd grade is working within small groups for reading and comprehension skills.

*3rd grade is working within small groups for both reading and math.

*In 4th grade we are working on math skills and reading comprehension.

* In 5th grade, time is spent on Lexia Core 5 to improve their reading, language, and comprehension skills.

We are continuing to use both scores from our fall NWEA MAP Growth assessment data as well as our data we are gathering from the use of our new online program, Lexia Core 5 to structure our Title time with students. Both the assessment (which covers subject areas of reading, math, and language arts) and the online program (which covers different reading skills such as comprehension and phonics) provide us with information about where each student is excelling as well as areas needed to work on. The students are making great progress! It is exciting to see them continue to grow.

9th Grade PE/Health: The 9th grade class had a unit over bowling. After practicing in the gym, the class will be heading to Arlington to bowl at the bowling alley. The 9th grade class always looks forward to this unit because they get to leave school to bowl. The 9th grade class has had other units in weightlifting, basketball, ultimate frisbee and other sports. The units that will be covered next are floor hockey, soccer, and other lifelong sports.
