Best of luck to our athletes and coaches during the upcoming winter seasons!



Dear Parents and Guardians.

As we approach the festive season and the much-anticipated Christmas break, I wanted to share important information regarding the upcoming semester tests and schedule adjustments for our students.

This year, we are introducing some changes regarding semester tests:

Eligible students who have demonstrated exceptional attendance (two days or fewer of absences) and maintained exemplary grades of A or B in both quarters have the option to forego semester tests in those specific classes. Students meeting these criteria and opting out of the semester test need not attend school during the scheduled test block on Wednesday or Thursday. However, it's essential to note that taking the test will only have a positive impact on their grades.

Regarding the middle school semester assessments:

Middle school students will not undergo traditional semester tests. Instead, they will engage in stimulating project-based assessments tailored to their classes. Additionally, on Thursday afternoon, the middle school students will partake in a fun event titled "Bah Humbug Days."

Transportation arrangements:

Buses will maintain their regular departure times.

High school students requiring bus transportation can utilize this service after school on both days.
