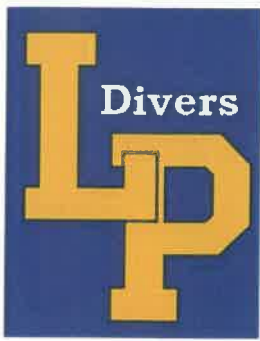

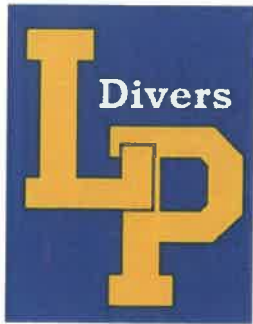

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Cooperative Update

Last week Mr. Felderman and I attended the SDHSAA meeting in Pierre. They approved our cooperative with Iroquois in all sports starting next year. We will be competing in 9-man football, unsure which class right now, class A for competitive cheer, and class B for all other sports. There have been a lot of moving parts to this process, but we wanted to give an update. We will now be in both the Dakota Valley Conference and the 281 Conference. This will impact the scheduling, but it will be an exciting change to play some new schools.

After meeting with Iroquois, we have moved forward with Iroquois-Lake Preston for the name. The color scheme used will be royal blue for the primary color, black for the secondary color, with accents of white and silver. There was also a survey form sent home to the parent/guardian list serve. We have also started the process of selecting jerseys for next year. Due to timeframes, we need to order them as soon as possible for the fall sports.

This will allow for our teams to compete at multiple levels including and possibly a 7th grade, 8th grade, C team, JV, and Varsity games.

10th World History: We just finished the Renaissance and Reformation and will be starting the scientific Revolution.

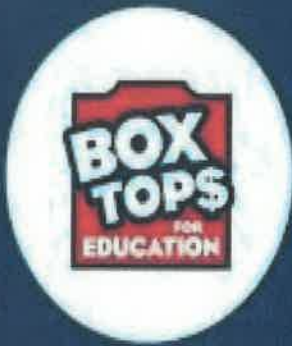

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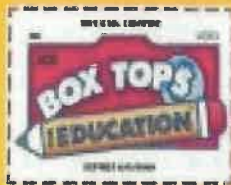
